

AA BADGE PRACTICAL ASSESSMENT SHEET

NETBALL AUSTRALIA

The 'AA' Badge is an elite umpiring qualification reserved for candidates who display the highest levels of technical proficiency, rule knowledge and game management

Candidates should demonstrate a complete understanding of all aspects of game management, and use good judgment and "game sense" to apply procedures and actions at the right time for the right purpose. Positioning and vision work together seamlessly to allow adaptation to different styles, patterns and paces of play, with minimal disruption to timing and decision-making.

There is a high level of decisional accuracy across major and minor infringements, with particular consistency and expertise in the application of the contact and advantage rules to enhance the contest and allow skilled play to occur. In addition, candidates should demonstrate the ability to prioritise correctly when there are multiple infringements, in order to maintain control and ensure that no team is unduly disadvantaged.

To successfully pass the AA Badge Practical Assessment, umpires must be rated as competent on all aspects of the assessable performance criteria. Testers only need to write a comment if the umpire has not achieved competency for a particular performance criteria. If the **ASSESSMENT DECISION** is **COMPETENT**, additional comments may be made in the General Comments section.

If the **ASSESSMENT DECISION** is **NOT YET COMPETENT**, the Testers need to outline the ACTION PLAN discussed with the umpire. The action plan statement should identify further training, development or assessment needs to assist the umpire to reach the competency standard. Completed assessment forms are to be given to the individual to upload to Netball Learning.

KEY

SOMETIMES:

Candidate shows basic level of knowledge of rules and procedures and demonstrates ability to apply skill in obvious situations.

USUALLY:

Candidate shows intermedial level of knowledge of rules and procedures and demonstrates ability to apply skill at most times in the game context.

CONSISTENTLY:

Candidate shows advanced level of knowledge of rules, procedures, and match protocols, and demonstrates ability to apply skill to a high standard across a broad range of situations.

EXPERTLY

Candidate shows detailed and extensive knowledge of rules, procedures, and match protocols; and applies skill to an expert level in all game situations, including complex and unorthodox scenarios.
